Prep Mat Finals at LU Tonight

Finals in the 44th annual National Prep School Wrestling Tournament are scheduled at Grace Hall tonight, with the first bout at 7. Some 304 bouts were wrestled in a session that began at 1 p.m. Friday and terminated at 1:15 a.m. today. Seventy-seven schools are represented by 351 matmen.

At the end of the quarterfinals, early this morning, St. Stephens School of Alexandrea, Va., was ahead in the scoring with 46 points but had only one man advancing. Blair Academy, of Blairstown, N.J., had 37 points and seven men advancing but six of them don't count in the scoring because they're postgraduate students.

Haverford School, of Haverford, Pa., was third with 35 points and had three men advancing.

Academy, Germantown paced by title-winning Jim Reilly, came from behind late in the final round Saturday to capture first place in the 44th annual National Prep School Wrestling Tournament at Grace Half on the Lehigh campus.

The Ft. Washington, Pa., matmen, coached by Alex Frazier, completed the two-day tournament with 77 points. Runnerup Haverford, Pa., School had 711/2, Episcopal Academy of Merion, Pa., 671/2, Penn Charter School of Philadelphia, 66%, Blair Academy of Blairstown, N.J., 631/2, and St. Stephen's School of Alexandria, Va., 61, to round out the Top Six in a very close finish.

Seventy-seven schools took art represented by 351 grapplers.

Germantown trailed Haverford in the title round 711/2 to 71, when its final wrestler - Reilly took the mat against Charles Moynagh of Tabor, Mass., Academy at 171 pounds. A victory for Reilly would mean the championship. A loss would allow Haverford to walk off with a onehalf point edge. Reilly ran up a big lead before pinning Moynagh in 4:29.

The pressure triumph, which gave Reilly his third title in National Prep Tournament history, also resulted in coaches voting him the Most Outstanding Wrestler trophy. A new award, the Robert Dalling Sr. trophy for the most falls, went to 136-pound champ Bob Hawthorne of Episcopal Academy who pinned five opponents in five bouts.

Germantown Academy accepted the James Detrixhe Memorial Trophy as team winner with NCAA champion Mark Lieberman of Lehigh making the presentation. Lieberman was a champion and Most Outstanding Wrestler in this tournament while at Blair. Craig Anderson, business manager of athletics at Lehigh, presented the Dalling Trophy and Bobby Weaver, last year's Most Outstanding Wrestler in the tourney, from Blair, made the presentation to Reilly. Weaver is a freshman on the Lehigh varsity squad.

Blair had four finalists and two of them won titles, but none figured in the scoring. All are post - graduate students who are allowed to compete but do not count in the standings. Salesianum had a similar situation with its representatives who official-

Originally Blair Academy, of Blairstown, N.J., was ranked No. 1 but a scoring re-check disclosed that points scored by a post-graduate entry had been erroneously included in the Blair total. Post-graduates are allowed to compete but their points don't count in the team standings.

The correction costs Blair five points and drops the New Jersey school into second place with 1391/2 points. Mt. St. Joseph's totaled 142 and, according to tournament director Gerry Leeman, is the 1980 champion.
